GreenMove: Event and Activities – No.2

Theme: Innovative Technologies for Sustainable Mobility and Energy Efficiency in Island and rural Contexts.

Overall Goal: Knowledge Exchange & Collaboration: Facilitate cross-border sharing of innovative solutions for sustainable mobility and energy efficiency tailored to island and rural challenges.

Democratic Dialogue & European Values: Promote inclusive discussions on European identity, EU belonging, and the role of democratic engagement in rural development.

Resource Development: Empower actionable tools (e.g., GISLG Guidebook) to empower rural stakeholders with practical strategies.

Event Summary:

From June 10th to 13th, 2025, the charming island of Malta (more precisely, the local council of Siggiewi) served as the dynamic host for the second major gathering of the GreenMove consortium. Organized by the Siggiewi Council, this event brought together 71 participants from 21 countries, including representatives from all 16 GreenMove partner nations. Attendees included leading researchers, NGO and CSO representatives, policymakers, rural development experts, and local stakeholders, creating a rich tapestry of perspectives united by a shared commitment to sustainable rural futures.

Key Activities & Outcomes:

The event's central theme, *Innovative Technologies for Sustainable Mobility and Energy Efficiency in Island and Rural Contexts*, guided four days of intensive knowledge exchange, collaborative problem-solving, and democratic dialogue. The workshop sessions featured compelling presentations from consortium members, each highlighting localized solutions to the unique mobility and energy challenges faced by rural and island communities. These ranged from microgrid implementations to e-mobility hubs, with a strong emphasis on scalability and cultural preservation. Interactive discussions allowed participants to delve deeper into pressing issues such as infrastructure gaps, renewable energy integration, and strategies to combat rural depopulation.

A parallel conference, *Promoting European Values and Democratic Dialogue in Island and Rural Communities*, provided a platform to explore the intersection of sustainability and civic engagement. The keynote address by Dr. Suzanne Maas of Friends of the Earth Malta and the University of Malta stood out as a highlight. Drawing from her work on the *Nature Therapy* and *AgroKatina* projects in Gozo, Dr. Maas demonstrated how community-led initiatives can simultaneously advance climate resilience and democratic participation. Panel debates further enriched the discourse, examining topics such as the evolving identity of rural Europe and the role of EU funding in empowering marginalized communities.

Beyond formal sessions, carefully curated cultural visits to Siggiewi and Città Ferdinand offered participants an immersive experience of Malta's heritage and contemporary sustainability efforts. These excursions not only showcased local traditions but also highlighted practical examples of community-driven agroecology and energy projects.

A significant tangible outcome of the event was the advancement of the *Interactive Sustainable Living Guidebook (GISLG)*. The second segment of this vital resource was drafted, incorporating case studies from the presentations, policy recommendations, and actionable templates for stakeholder engagement. Designed as a practical toolkit for rural communities across Europe, the GISLG reflects the collective expertise and on-the-ground insights shared during the event.

Conference: "Promoting European Values and Democratic Dialogue in Island and Rural Communities"

- **Keynote by Dr. Suzanne Maas** (Friends of the Earth Malta/University of Malta):
 - Highlighted the *Nature Therapy* and *AgroKatina* projects in Gozo as models for community-led sustainability.
 - Emphasized the nexus between climate action and democratic participation.

- **Panel debates** explored:
 - Rural identity (traditions vs. modernization).
 - EU funding's role in empowering marginalized communities.
- **Participatory data collection:** Live polling and workshops gathered insights on rural needs and EU policy gaps.

The dissemination of outcomes was thorough and multifaceted. A detailed report—available in PDF and PowerPoint formats—captured key proceedings, findings, and participant feedback. High-quality photographs and promotional materials further documented the event's vibrancy. All 17 partner municipalities published summaries on their official websites, while the newly launched *greenmove.site* provided a centralized digital hub for project resources. Social media campaigns, driven by participants, ensured broad visibility, with press releases translated into 16+ languages and distributed across all partner countries.

Development of the Interactive Sustainable Living Guidebook (GISLG): A significant outcome of the event was the successful drafting of the second segment of the Interactive Sustainable Living Guidebook (GISLG). This initial draft incorporated key takeaways, valuable insights, and practical information gleaned from the insightful workshop presentations.

The GISLG is envisioned as a practical and accessible resource for island and rural stakeholders, designed to promote sustainable practices based on live and realistic scenarios, facilitate the sharing of best practices, and empower individuals and communities to adopt more sustainable lifestyles.

Documentation & Dissemination:

A comprehensive report was meticulously produced in both PDF and PowerPoint formats to document the event's key activities, outcomes, and insights. This report featured:

- Detailed summaries of the event proceedings and key findings from the discussions.
- PDF/PPT summaries of proceedings, key findings, and participant feedback.
- Photo galleries and promotional materials (roll-ups, leaflets, flyers and e-banners).
- A collection of high-quality photographs and promotional materials (including flyers, Roll-Ups and e-banners) capturing the essence of the event.
- Accurate attendance records, detailed agendas for both the workshop and conference, and valuable participant feedback.
- Public summaries on all 17 partner websites.
- Upskill of *greenmove.site* as a central resource hub.
- Social media campaigns by participants (100% coverage across consortium countries).
- Press releases disseminated in 16+ languages, securing media coverage in all partner nations
- To ensure wider accessibility and dissemination of the event's outcomes, a public summary was published on the official websites of the participating municipalities.
- A foundational second part of the dedicated project webpage (*greenmove.site*) was successfully launched, providing an initial online presence for the GreenMove project and serving as a repository for key information.
- All the participants, have uploaded the News Release of the outcome of the three days in Siggiewi, Malta and Event no.2 in their social media.
- Last but not least, nearly all the participants sent out the Press Release of the results with great outcome nearly in all 17 countries

This Malta gathering not only strengthened the GreenMove network but also set a solid foundation for the consortium's next steps. By blending technological innovation with democratic values and cultural awareness, the event underscored the potential of rural and island communities to lead Europe's sustainability transition. The insights gained will directly inform the upcoming third meeting in Podstrana (Croatia, October 15th -18th), ensuring continuity and deepening the project's impact.

Project Main Activities:

T2.1 Event No. 2 - Seamless Logistics for Pan-European Collaboration - The successful execution of Event No. 2 hinged on our meticulous coordination of international and local travel, accommodation, and meal arrangements for all participants. Recognizing the importance of smooth logistics, we implemented a proactive communication strategy to ensure clarity and efficiency at every stage. Participants received detailed itineraries, accommodation confirmations, and 24/7 support contacts, alongside personalized assistance for any unforeseen travel disruptions. Our approach prioritized accessibility, comfort, and sustainability—selecting eco-friendly hotels and optimizing transport routes to minimize carbon footprints. By fostering open communication and contingency planning, we created a seamless experience that allowed attendees to focus entirely on the event's intellectual and collaborative goals.

T2.2 Event No. 2 - Thematic Core: Sustainable Mobility & Democratic Dialogue

Title: *Innovation Meets Identity: Bridging Technology and European Values*

Expert Conference: "Promoting European Values and Democratic Dialogue in Island and Rural Communities" - This conference served as the intellectual cornerstone of Event No. 2, convening researchers, policymakers, key stakeholders and the public to explore the intersection of sustainability and European identity in rural/island contexts. Through curated keynotes (notably Dr. Suzanne Maas's insights from Gozo's AgroKatina project) through the MICROMOBI toolkit and panel debates, we dissected themes like:

- Cultural Heritage as a Catalyst for sustainable mobility solutions.
- EU Policy Alignment, emphasizing the Green Deal's role in rural resilience.
- Democratic Participation in local energy transitions.

Interactive formats—including live polling and breakout sessions—transformed theoretical discourse into actionable strategies, with data collected directly informing the GISLG Guidebook.

Venue Strategy & Cultural Immersion

The event was hosted at Dar tal-Providenza (founded by Mons. Michael Azzopardi in 1965 with the aim of offering a home with a warm and family-like environment for persons with disabilities who for some reason or another cannot stay living with their family), the, selected for its capacity to blend professional rigor with cultural authenticity. Criteria included:

- Technological readiness (high-speed connectivity, AV support).
- Spatial flexibility for plenaries, workshops, and networking.
- Proximity to cultural sites, enabling immersive tours to Siggiewi and Città Ferdinand. These visits showcased Malta's heritage while grounding discussions in real-world examples of community-led sustainability.

GISLG Guidebook: From Theory to Practice

The second segment of the *Interactive Sustainable Living Guidebook (GISLG)* was developed collaboratively, integrating:

- Case studies from Partner's Island/rural mobility pilots.
- Community engagement templates, tested during workshop simulations.
