Gotse Delchev – context and potential

- The municipality is a regional center for 35,000 residents.
- In recent years, projects under the Regional development and Recovery and resilience plan have been implemented for:
 - urban development;
 - energy efficiency and accessible infrastructure;
 - landscaping and improving mobility.
- Sustainable urban planning is being developed, including:
 - new pedestrian alleys and bicycle routes;
 - accessible sidewalks and ramps;
 - improved lighting and security.

Accessibility	New ramps and sidewalks with tactile stripes	Social inclusion
Environmentally friendly	Promoting walking and cycling	Reduced emissions
Safety	Improved street lighting and pedestrian crossings	Protection of life
Intelligent approach	Integrated traffic management	Efficiency and comfort

European values in a local context

Value	Example in Gotse Delchev
Equality	Barrier-free access to public buildings and parks
Solidarity	Municipal transport accessible to people with disabilities
Respect for nature	Green areas and natural surfaces everywhere in populated areas
Promoting movement	Hiking trails adapted for people with reduced mobility and children
Accessibility	Toilets for disabled on public places
