GreenMove: Event and Activities – No.6 Transnational Meeting

Event Title: “Sustainable and Social Inclusion: Empowering Women in Mountainous Regions through Mobility and Gender Equality”

Thematic Focus: Integrated Transportation Infrastructure for Sustainable Mountainous Development: Enhancing Gender Equality, Social Inclusion, and Holistic Societal Progress;

The 6th and final transnational meeting of the GreenMove consortium was hosted by the Municipality of Valongo, Portugal, brought together the 17 partners from the 16 countries. The event combined workshops, national presentations, cultural visits, and interactive activities to address the unique mobility barriers faced by women, elderly citizens, persons with disabilities, and low-income residents in mountainous regions. Key sessions focused on co-designing gender-responsive transport solutions, sharing best practices (including Valongo’s “YouTubeTrainers” intergenerational digital inclusion programme), and reinforcing the link between mobility, social inclusion, and European values. Cultural visits to Quinta das Arcas winery and the Oficina da Regueifa e do Biscoito bakery museum, together with traditional dances by Valongo’s Senior Dance Academy, (a group which is supported 100% by the Municipality of Valongo) enriched the participatory atmosphere. The 6th event concluded with a comprehensive evaluation of the specific meeting about also the entire GreenMove project, confirming that all objectives were met or exceeded. Partners filled in the 4 page questionnaire, and have expressed unanimous commitment to keeping the consortium and its core outcomes alive for at least another two years – through the WhatsApp group, the social media and the development of a subnetwork of Citizen Science Observatories, but also through the Digital Toolbox (which we are all sharing through the GreenMove Google drive), and active preparation of a new funding project, whether this will be an Interreg Europe or a LIFE follow-up proposal. The evaluation highlighted the project’s lasting impact on rural mobility, gender equality, and citizen engagement, ensuring that the GreenMove legacy will continue to grow across Europe.

Overall Goal: The overall goal of this 6th and final meeting of the GreenMove was to share and promote gender-sensitive transportation infrastructure that directly responds to the unique mobility needs of women in mountainous regions – from safe, well-lit paths and affordable on-demand services to accessible public transport – thereby enhancing their daily mobility, economic participation, and overall, well-being. To recommend and implement social inclusion measures that guarantee equal access to transport services for every community member, irrespective of gender, age, or socio-economic background, ensuring that no one is left behind in the green transition. To actively promote and protect European Union values – transparency, accountability, the rule of law, and democratic principles – by engaging all stakeholders in collaborative initiatives that strengthen good governance and participatory decision-making at local and regional levels. To facilitate knowledge sharing and cross-sectoral collaboration focused on the adoption of sustainable transportation practices in mountainous regions, including the use of electric vehicles, efficient public transport, and non-motorized modes (walking, cycling), with the dual aim of reducing environmental impact and improving air quality for fragile mountain ecosystems. To raise awareness and build lasting capacity among local communities, policymakers, and key stakeholders on the critical importance of gender equality and social inclusion in the design, funding, and operation of transportation infrastructure. Finally, to encourage and sustain knowledge exchange and collaborative partnerships among a wide range of actors – governments, NGOs, international organizations, private sector, and citizen groups – so that best practices and resources can be leveraged effectively for the long-term, sustainable development of Europe’s mountainous regions. Through these integrated efforts, the 6th GreenMove meeting put the stepping stone to create a replicable, transformative model for gender-just, inclusive, and environmentally sound mobility that can be adapted by mountain communities across the continent, ensuring that the legacy of GreenMove endures far beyond the project’s formal conclusion.

Key Activities & Outcomes:

The sixth transnational meeting in Valongo, Portugal, successfully delivered a comprehensive programme of activities, producing lasting outcomes for gender-equitable and socially inclusive mobility in mountainous regions.

1. Workshop on Empowering Women through Mobility & Gender Equality- An intensive workshop brought together partners, local stakeholders, and community representatives to co-design strategies for integrated transportation infrastructure that addresses the specific needs of women, the elderly, persons with disabilities, and low-income residents in mountainous areas. Participants mapped local barriers (physical, economic, cultural, temporal) and developed actionable recommendations for gender-responsive transport planning.

2. Expert round-table on Sustainable Mountainous Development - A high-level conference featuring experts from academia, civil society, and regional authorities explored the nexus of mountain development, gender equality, and social inclusion. Keynote contributions highlighted successful EU-funded projects (e.g., ICTr-CE, BringásVándor) and the role of citizen science in shaping inclusive

mobility policies. Panel discussions reinforced the importance of EU-level collaboration and the European Day of Sustainable Mobility.

3. Cultural Visits & Heritage Immersion - Participants experienced Valongo's rich cultural landscape through guided visits to Quinta das Arcas winery (with traditional dances by the Senior Dance Academy) and the Oficina da Regueifa e do Biscoito bakery museum, where partners engaged in an interactive baking session. These activities fostered a sense of shared European identity and community pride.

4. Town Hall Engagement - A dedicated visit to the Valongo Town Hall allowed partners to meet with Mayor Paulo Esteves Ferreira and local officials. Discussions focused on the municipality's award-winning social innovation programmes (including the "YouTubeTrainers" digital inclusion initiative) and how local governance can mainstream gender equality into transport infrastructure investments.

5. Finalisation of the 6th GISLG Chapter - The sixth and final chapter of the Interactive Sustainable Living Guidebook (GISLG) was completed, focusing on *Integrated Transportation Infrastructure for Sustainable Mountainous Development: Enhancing Gender Equality, Social Inclusion, and Holistic Societal Progress*. The chapter emphasises EU-level collaboration, solid practices from 15+ regions, and the adoption of Universal Design principles.

6. Expansion of Communication & Dissemination - The consortium agreed to extend the GreenMove communication strategy beyond the project's end, including:

- A synchronised social media campaign across all 17 partners highlighting the Valongo outcomes.
- Publication of a final press release in over 15 languages.
- Integration of meeting results into the Forum of Adriatic and Ionian Cities (FAIC) newsletter.
- Permanent availability of the Digital Toolbox and GISLG on the project website.
- Participation to the ALTA's Annual International Conference for Education - <https://ndma.lt/alta2026/language/en/about-conference/>

7. Comprehensive Evaluation of the Project - A multi-level evaluation (intermediate, internal, external, and self-assessment) was conducted, covering the entire event and all activities. Key findings:

- 100% of objectives met or exceeded.
- Participant satisfaction rate: 92% (disaggregated by sex, age, disability).
- Concrete commitments from 17 partner municipalities to sustain Citizen Science Observatories.
- Unanimous agreement to pursue an Interreg Europe of LIFE follow-up proposal to scale the GreenMove methodology.
- Inclusive citizen engagement strategies that actively involve all community members) without any gender criteria) in mobility planning, ensuring equal opportunities regardless of gender, age, or socio-economic background.
- A showcase of successful EU-funded projects, demonstrating how European support drives sustainable mobility and societal progress, while highlighting the importance of cross-border collaboration.

Strategic Dissemination & Legacy Building – Valongo Edition

The 6th and final GreenMove meeting in Valongo, was not an endpoint – it was a launchpad for a permanent European movement. The consortium deliberately transformed the meeting's outcomes into a strategic legacy asset through a multi-layered dissemination campaign that combined authoritative documentation, coordinated digital amplification, grassroots social media advocacy, and tangible commitments to sustain the network for years to come.

1. Authoritative Documentation for Strategic Impact

A comprehensive suite of materials was produced to ensure that Valongo's breakthroughs – from gender-responsive mobility indicators to the "YouTubeTrainers" model – would be preserved, shared, and replicated across Europe.

The Valongo Report: This definitive outcome synthesises:

- Full proceedings of the workshop on empowering women in mountainous and peripheral regions.
- Detailed summaries of the expert presentation, including keynote presentations from the Municipality of Valongo (Social Innovation Department) and the ICTr-CE project.
- Actionable recommendations for gender-sensitive transport planning, with a dedicated section on monitoring indicators (e.g., 50% of women reporting improved access to healthcare, 40% of elderly using on-demand shuttles).
- A complete record of the 17 partner presentations, each highlighting local data on women's mobility barriers.
- The finalised sixth chapter of the GISLG, focused on *Integrated Transportation Infrastructure for Sustainable Mountainous Development: Enhancing Gender Equality, Social Inclusion, and Holistic Societal Progress*.

- A special annex: “Valongo’s Social Innovation Playbook” – a short guide to replicating the “YouTubeTrainers” intergenerational digital inclusion programme.

Persuasive Communication Toolkit (PPT + video/photo summary): A dynamic PowerPoint presentation was engineered for different audiences:

- *Executive version:* For municipal councils and regional authorities, highlighting key messages and policy recommendations.
- *Community version:* Using simple language, visuals, and quotes from Community Researchers to share with local citizen groups.
- A **highlight short video** captured the meeting’s energy, including Mayor Paulo Esteves Ferreira’s opening speech, the senior dance performance, and testimonials from partners.

Professional Brand Assets: A complete library of high-resolution photographs (100+ images) was organised into thematic folders: workshops, roundtables, cultural visits (Quinta das Arcas winery, bakery museum), and social moments. All images were captioned and released under a Creative Commons license for partner use through the dedicated Google Drive. Additionally, branded templates (roll-up banners, social media cards, event agendas) were created to ensure a unified visual identity for any future GreenMove-related activity.

2. Synchronised European Amplification

To ensure that Valongo’s outcomes resonated at local, national, and EU levels, the consortium executed a precisely coordinated, multi-channel dissemination offensive.

Coordinated Publishing Wave (17 partners, 16 countries): On the same day (10 May 2026), all partner municipalities published tailored PR summaries of the Valongo meeting on their official websites/social media. Each summary was adapted to local language and context, but shared a common structure and key messages:

- Quotes from the Mayor of Valongo.
- The adoption of gender-sensitive mobility indicators.
- The commitment to an Interreg Europe follow-up. This synchronised action created a powerful cross-border echo, demonstrating European unity and landing credible, locally relevant information directly into regional policy environments.

Strategic Digital Hub Update: The GreenMove platform (www.greenmove.site) was transformed into a permanent legacy repository. New features include:

- A dedicated “Valongo 2026 / 6th meeting” section with the full Report, presentation toolkit, and photo gallery.
- The GreenMove Scoreboard – To measure the Progress – an accountability Tool – www.greenmove.site/greenmove-scorecard/
- A download counter for the GISLG and Digital Toolbox - www.greenmove.site/gislg/

- **Multilingual Media Engagement (15+ languages):** A flagship press release – titled “*GreenMove Final Meeting in Valongo: Celebrating inclusion innovation and European Sustainability*” – was professionally trans created into all partner languages. It was distributed via the local Municipalities and their Media service offices. With the following results:

- A feature article in the **Forum of Adriatic and Ionian Cities (FAIC)** newsletter, reaching over 40 municipalities in the Adriatic-Ionian basin.
- A series of media pickups across the partner countries.

- **Grassroots Advocacy Wave:** A participant-driven social media campaign, coordinated through a shared content calendar, produced over **30+ posts** across LinkedIn, X/Twitter, Facebook, and Instagram. Partners used a common set of hashtags (#GreenMove #Valongo #WomenInMobility #sustainabletransportation). The campaign reached many thousands of **social media users** within three weeks, with the most viral post being a video of the Senior Dance Academy performance. The campaign also generated **20+ mentions** from non-partner organisations (NGOs, CSO’s other organisations).

3. Concrete Legacy Commitments

Beyond reporting and media, the Valongo meeting produced a set of practical, low threshold, and sustainable commitments that guarantee the GreenMove spirit endures without imposing heavy administrative burdens on partners.

- ✓ **Continued Social Media Presence:** All 17 partners agreed to maintain an active #GreenMove presence on their social media channels (LinkedIn, Facebook, X/Twitter, Instagram), sharing updates, best practices, and relevant EU news. A shared content calendar will be used for at

- least four coordinated posts per year (e.g., European Day of Sustainable Mobility on 9 May, International Women’s Day, World Environment Day).
- ✓ Beyond reporting and media, the Valongo meeting produced a set of practical, low threshold, and sustainable commitments that guarantee the GreenMove spirit endures without imposing heavy administrative burdens on partners.
 - ✓ Continued Social Media Presence: All 17 partners agreed to maintain an active #GreenMove presence on their social media channels (LinkedIn, Facebook, X/Twitter, Instagram), sharing updates, best practices, and relevant EU news. A shared content calendar will be used for at least four coordinated posts per year (e.g., European Day of Sustainable Mobility on 9 May, International Women’s Day, World Environment Day).
 - ✓ **European Day of Sustainable Mobility (9 May):** The consortium’s formal call to the European Commission was reaffirmed. Municipality of Valongo pledged to host a “**Mobility Festival**” on 9 May 2027, inviting all GreenMove partners and showcasing electric shuttles, bike-sharing, and “YouTubeTrainers” workshops. The event will be used to pressure the Commission for an official recognition of the Day.
 - ✓ **Interreg Europe or LIFE Roadmap:** A detailed roadmap was presented and discussed. Key milestones:
 - **June/July 2026:** Form a core writing team (RTIS Network, Municipality of Valongo, Municipality of Fano, Westpannon).
 - **August 2026:** Submit a concept note to either the Interreg Europe or the LIFE call (policy learning).
 - **September 2026:** Full proposal submission.
 - **Priority theme:** “Gender-responsive and socially inclusive mobility in low-density regions.”
 - ✓ **Gender Equality Task Force:** A voluntary working group of six partners was established to continue developing gender-sensitive indicators, train Community Researchers, and produce a “Toolkit for Gender-Responsive Mobility Audits” – to be published by October 2026, free on the Digital Toolbox.

Through these strategic dissemination efforts and concrete legacy commitments, the Valongo meeting transformed the GreenMove project into a **self-sustaining European movement**. The consortium did not simply conclude – it **re-launched** with a clear roadmap, a stronger gender focus, and an unwavering commitment to keep the network alive, influential, and growing for years to come.

Project Main Activities:

T6.1 – Coordination of Transportation, Accommodation and Logistics- The successful execution of Event No. 6 was anchored by a meticulously planned logistics operation, designed to seamlessly integrate international travel, local transit, premium accommodation, and bespoke catering for a diverse multinational delegation. The Municipality of Valongo, as host, implemented a proactive, participant-centric protocol, delivering comprehensive pre-arrival dossiers, confirmed itineraries, and on-site support to ensure a smooth experience for all attendees. Unlike the previous meeting in Paphos, no travel disruptions occurred, allowing full in-person participation from all partner countries. Sustainable principles were embedded through partnerships with eco-certified hotels, locally sourced catering, and

low-impact transport options (electric shuttles for cultural visits). This end-to-end, forward-thinking approach created an environment of operational reliability and well-being, enabling every attendee to focus entirely on the event's substantive intellectual exchange and collaborative outcomes.

T6.2 – Workshop, Expert Conference, Cultural Visits, Town Hall Engagement & GISLG

Finalisation - The core of the meeting consisted of a multi-stranded programme addressing gender-equitable mobility in mountainous regions.

- Workshop on Empowering Women through Mobility & Gender Equality: An interactive workshop brought together local authorities, transport providers, citizens, and experts to co-design gender-sensitive transport solutions. Participants mapped physical, economic, cultural, and temporal barriers faced by women, elderly, and persons with disabilities in mountainous areas, producing actionable recommendations for integrated infrastructure.
- Expert Conference on Sustainable Mountainous Development: A high-level conference featured keynote contributions from regional policymakers, gender equality specialists, and representatives of EU-funded projects (e.g., ICTr-CE, BringásVándor). Panels explored how sustainable transport can reduce territorial inequalities, enhance women's economic participation, and align with EU values of transparency and democratic governance.
- Cultural Visits & Heritage Immersion: Participants experienced Valongo's rich cultural landscape through guided visits to Quinta das Arcas winery, where the Senior Dance Academy of Valongo performed traditional dances, and the Oficina da Regueifa e do Biscoito (Bakery Museum), where partners engaged in an interactive baking session. These activities fostered a sense of shared European identity and community pride.
- Visit to Valongo Town Hall: A dedicated session at the Town Hall allowed partners to meet Mayor Paulo Esteves Ferreira and local officials. Discussions centred on Valongo's award-winning social innovation programmes, including the intergenerational "YouTubeTrainers" digital inclusion initiative, and how local governance can mainstream gender equality into transport infrastructure investments.
- Finalisation of the 6th GISLG Chapter: The sixth and final chapter of the Interactive Sustainable Living Guidebook (GISLG) was completed, focusing on *Integrated Transportation Infrastructure for Sustainable Mountainous Development: Enhancing Gender Equality, Social Inclusion, and Holistic Societal Progress*. The chapter emphasises EU-level collaboration, best practices from mountain regions, and the adoption of Universal Design principles.

T6.3 – Communication and Dissemination Plan Expansion - The communication strategy for the Valongo meeting was designed to maximize the visibility of the project's final outcomes and to establish a lasting legacy.

Digital Knowledge Commons: The project website (greenmove.site) was updated with a dedicated "Valongo 2026" section, hosting the full Legacy Report, the final GISLG, presentation toolkits, and a high-resolution photo gallery. An interactive map displaying all 17 permanent Citizen Science Observatories was launched.

Synchronized Partner Amplification: All 17 partner municipalities simultaneously published tailored summaries of the Valongo meeting on their official websites, creating a powerful cross border echo that delivered key messages directly into local policy contexts.

Multilingual Media Engagement: A flagship press release – "GreenMove Final Meeting in Valongo: Celebrates Inclusion, Innovation, and European Solidarity" – was professionally translated into 15 languages and distributed to over 40 regional and national media outlets, securing coverage across 12 countries. The results were also featured in the Forum of Adriatic and Ionian Cities (FAIC) newsletter, reaching 40+ municipalities.

Grassroots Social Media Campaign: A participant driven campaign generated over 30 posts across LinkedIn, X/Twitter, Facebook, and Instagram, using hashtags #GreenMove, #Valongo #WomenInMobility #DemosKratos #GenderEqualTransport. The campaign reached many hundreds of users within three weeks, with the most viral post being a video of the Senior Dance Academy performance in ARCAS

T6.4 – Project Coordination Gatherings - Throughout the event, structured coordination sessions were held to monitor progress against the final project milestones. Daily morning briefings with all partners ensured alignment, addressed emerging issues, and facilitated real-time decision-making. A dedicated closing coordination meeting formalised the commitments to sustain the GreenMove network.

T6.5 – Monitoring and Evaluation - A comprehensive multi-level evaluation was conducted, covering the entire event and the overall project. The evaluation included:

- ✓ Participant satisfaction surveys (disaggregated by sex, age, disability), achieving a 92% satisfaction rate.
- ✓ Internal self-assessment by each partner on their contributions and capacity building.

- ✓ External review of the event's impact on local policy (documented by the Municipality of Valongo).
- ✓ Final project assessment confirming that all objectives were met or exceeded.

Key findings: 100% partner commitment to continue the GreenMove legacy; unanimous approval of the Interreg Europe follow-up proposal; and a clear roadmap for the permanent European network of local eco-system Observatories.

The successful execution of the GreenMove initiative – particularly the 5th transnational meeting in Paphos – relied on a robust governance model that ensured alignment, accountability, and agile responsiveness across the consortium, even when travel was impossible for seven of the 16 participating countries. A systematic schedule of strategic project coordination meetings was instituted,

designed not only to monitor progress against key deliverables but also to foster synergistic collaboration among all partners – bridging physical distance through seamless hybrid integration. These gatherings served as critical platforms for conducting in-depth reviews of ongoing activities, identifying emerging risks (such as travel disruptions), and facilitating data-driven decision-making in real time. Through disciplined reporting, transparent dialogue, and the active use of remote participation tools, we maintained dynamic oversight of project trajectories while enabling collective problem-solving across borders. This proactive, adaptive approach to coordination – integrating operational oversight, strategic foresight, and hybrid delivery – proved fundamental to maximising impact, optimising resources, and ensuring the timely achievement of GreenMove’s overarching mission, even against considerable odds.

T5.5 Monitoring and Evaluation for Continuous Improvement – Paphos Edition

The GreenMove initiative was propelled by a deliberately architected governance framework, caused to convert a multinational consortium into a unified, high-performance entity – even when travel was impossible for seven of the 16 participating countries. We transcended basic coordination by instituting a rhythm of strategic command meetings, designed as operational engines to synchronise efforts, enforce accountability, and execute with precision. These were not passive checkpoints but active sessions for strategic alignment, anticipatory risk mitigation, and data-validated decision-making – conducted seamlessly in a hybrid format that integrated remote partners as full participants.

Through mandatory, disciplined reporting and transparent intelligence-sharing, we maintained real-time situational awareness across all workstreams. This created a dynamic, adaptive control system that proactively steered the project through unforeseen travel disruptions, optimising resource allocation and collective problem-solving velocity. This framework of rigorous oversight fused with strategic foresight proved to be the foundational infrastructure that guaranteed flawless execution, maximised catalytic impact, and ensured the uncompromising delivery of GreenMove’s transformative outcomes – demonstrating that a well-engineered governance model can thrive under pressure.

T5.6 Event Impact & Strategic Horizon: Solidifying the Legacy – The Paphos Turning Point

The Paphos meeting marked a definitive inflection point for GreenMove, transitioning the consortium from a collaborative project into a self-sustaining European movement – achieved against considerable odds, with seven countries participating remotely. The assembly achieved its core objectives: advancing participatory strategies, embedding holistic societal progress into mobility planning, and enriching the GISLG with its fifth chapter. However, its historic import lies in the ratification and operationalisation of two pioneering mandates that will permanently extend the project’s impact.

1. The GreenMove Sustainability Covenant: Activating a Shared Legacy

Building on the momentum from previous meetings, consortium partners reaffirmed and activated the GreenMove Sustainability Covenant – a binding commitment to co-create and populate an open-access digital Knowledge Vault. This strategic platform, championed by the RTIS Network, systematically aggregates and deploys the most effective e-tools, strategic models, and policy blueprints harvested from both GreenMove and decades of prior EU investment. By transforming isolated innovations into a collective intellectual common, the Covenant guarantees that any municipality can implement cutting-edge sustainability solutions without prohibitive cost, ensuring equitable access to progress and maximising the compound return on European funding. The Paphos meeting added concrete case studies from the hybrid delivery experience, enriching the Vault with lessons on resilient, tenacious project execution.

2. The Strategic Pathway to Valongo and Beyond

Paphos established the operational architecture; the forthcoming strategic convening in **Valongo, Portugal (3–6 May 2026)** is now positioned to **finalise and institutionalise** this legacy. That final meeting will focus on empowering women in mountainous regions through mobility and gender equality, bringing the project’s journey full circle. We will advance from co-creating knowledge to co-executing solutions, deepening the project’s concrete impact on European communities – particularly on social inclusion and the fight against stereotypes.

By institutionalising its outputs and demonstrating resilience through hybrid delivery, GreenMove has ensured that its spirit of pragmatic problem-solving and unwavering commitment to an inclusive future will continue to guide and inspire action, securing its role as a cornerstone of Europe’s sustainable development landscape for years to come.
